

8th Commandment T/F

- 1) A good reputation is important because we want other people to trust us, like us, think well of us and to respect us.
- 2) The world is anxious for reputations to be ruined and thinks a good name isn't really important.
- 3) Anytime we say something that hurts another person's reputation (not just in court), by saying mean things or gossiping, we break the 8th Commandment.
- 4) The 8th Commandment teaches us how to talk about other people. Even if something is true, we should not talk about what we know so that others won't think badly of them.
The Jewish leaders had false witnesses testify against Jesus. Because of this He was condemned and sent to the cross.
- 5) Peter was asked whether he knew Jesus and he lied, swearing he didn't know Jesus because Peter wanted to save himself.
- 6) When it comes down to God's Law, we are all false witnesses.
- 7) Your sins are forgiven in Jesus and now you are a perfect, honest, and truth-speaking child of God in Jesus.
