## For Us He Died, For Us He Rose

Skim and review John 18-19.

**1. What does Jesus suffer in these chapters?**

Jesus was betrayed by Judas and then arrested, bound, beaten, and slandered. He is denied by Peter three times, mocked with a crown of thorns and purple robe, flogged, condemned, forced to carry His Cross, stripped naked, and crucified.

Read 1 Peter 3:18-21.

**2. Why does Jesus suffer all these things?**

FOR YOU! He suffered for your sins and by His wounds, you are healed. He, the righteous, suffered and died for us, the unrighteous, to bring us to God

Read 1 Corinthians 15:54-57.

**3. What does the death and resurrection of Jesus accomplish for you?**

Death is swallowed up in victory. The sting of death is overcome by life. The power of sin is stripped away. We have the victory over sin, death, and the devil through Jesus, for us.

Read Romans 6:3-11.

**4. How can I know His birth, life, death, and resurrection are for me?**

All of us who have been baptized are baptized into Him, into His birth, into His Baptism, into His life, and crucified with Him that we would be raised with Him. Baptism says Jesus is FOR YOU!

Read 1 Corinthians 10:16-17.

**5. What if I don't remember my Baptism? Is there another way to know that Jesus is for me?**

In Communion, we are made participants in the Body and Blood of Christ. We have union with Him there. What happened to Him in John 18-19 happened to us as He stood in our place,

condemned for us, crucified for us, Body given and Blood shed for you to eat and to drink. The bread and wine, Body and Blood, put into your mouth is not only for your neighbor, it is FOR YOU!

- 6. If you have been crucified with Christ in your Baptism and been made a participant of His suffering in the Lord's Supper, does God leave any doubt of your resurrection?**

He leaves no doubt. God has done it all FOR YOU!

**Read Revelation 21:1-7.**

- 7. Since this Gospel is FOR YOU, for what do you hope?**

God will create me new in His kingdom. He came to me to bring me to Him. He became like me to make me like Him (again). He would be my God and I His child to dwell together forever for the dwelling place of God is with man forever.

## For Us He Lived

Read Matthew 3:13-17.

1. **Why is Jesus baptized? Whom does the Baptism of Jesus benefit?**

Jesus is baptized to “fulfill all righteousness.” Jesus is already righteous so His Baptism benefits you.

2. **Whom does your Baptism benefit, you or God?**

You.

Read Matthew 4:1-11.

3. **Where does Jesus go after His Baptism? Who makes Him go there?**

Jesus goes to the wilderness; He is led by the Holy Spirit

4. **Why does that person take Him there? What happens?**

The Holy Spirit takes Him there to be tempted by the devil.

5. **What is the outcome of these events?**

Jesus overcomes the devil and his temptations.

Read Hebrews 2:14-18 and 4:15.

6. **Why does the temptation of Jesus matter to you?**

Jesus was tempted just as we are tempted. He can sympathize with us and help us in our temptation. He partook of the same things we do, for us and with us, like us in every respect except that He was without sin.

7. **Name other examples of Jesus' partaking of the same things we do and feeling the same things we feel.**

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Jesus gets tired and needs sleep (Matthew 8:18, 23-27; Mark 4:35-41; Luke 8:22-25), Jesus is rejected by His friends (Matthew 13:53-58), Jesus gets angry (Matthew 21:12-16; Mark 11:15-18; Luke 19:45-47; John 2:14-16), Jesus agonizes due to stress (Luke 22:44); and Jesus gets hungry and thirsty (John 4:7-8; John 19:28).

## **8. How do we know Jesus is able to help us when we are tempted or struggling?**

He has been there, too, and overcomes our every struggle. He knows what it takes to endure and succeed. He knows what you need in order to endure and succeed. He endured and succeeded for us when we were not able.

**Read John 20:30-31.**

## **9. Why does Jesus endure temptation, hunger, thirst, exhaustion, and all of the difficulties of this mortal life? Why does He pray, teach, perform miracles and signs, and do everything He does throughout His life?**

He does these things FOR YOU, that He would overcome this life, death, and the devil for you so that you might believe, and by believing you may have life in His Name.

## Like Us For Us

Read John 1:1-14.

1. **In verses 1-5, how is “the Word” described? Who is “the Word” and what did He do?**

God (Jesus, the Son), created all things and is the life and light of the world.

2. **In verse 14, what happens to “the Word”? For what purpose does this happen?**

The Word became flesh. God became man. He came to dwell among us.

3. **In verses 11-13, why does “the Word” become flesh?**

He comes to His own (to us) to give us the right to become children of God.

Read Hebrews 1:2-4.

4. **Is Jesus an angel? Was Jesus created? Were angels created?**

No. Jesus is God, not an angel. Jesus was not created but begotten of the Father. Angels were created by Jesus.

5. **Who is greater, the Son or the angels?**

The Son, the creator of the world (and angels), the radiance of the glory of God, the exact imprint of His nature, as much superior to the angels as the Name He has inherited.

Read Hebrews 2:9-11.

6. **According to *these verses*, who is greater, the Son or the angels?**

The angels are greater only because Jesus was made lower for a little while when He became flesh.

7. **In verses 10-11, why was the Son made lower than the angels?**

“...to bring many sons to glory,” to be the “founder of their salvation,” to sanctify us and make us brothers. FOR YOU!

Read John 3:16 and Ephesians 3:18-19.

- 8. Why does the Father send His Son for you? Why does the Son humble himself, setting aside the glory of His throne in Heaven, for you?**

Because of His love for you, He humbles Himself that you might know the breadth, length, height, and depth of His love for you.

- 9. Is there any reason other than His love that God would take on our mortal form?**

No. He does this only out of fatherly, divine goodness and mercy, without any merit or worthiness in us.
