Memory Work

Recite the entire Six Chief Parts of the catechism.

Brain Break Time!

Stretch it out!

Get rid of the stress! Take a few minutes to stretch your arms, legs, and body. Just get the blood flowing again!

Instruction/Discussion

What does God say about all these commandments?

He says, "I, the Lord your God, am a jealous God, punishing the children for the sin of the fathers to the third and fourth generation of those who hate Me, but showing love to a thousand generations of those who love Me and keep My commandments." (Exodus 20:5-6)



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What does this mean?

God threatens to punish all who break these commandments. Therefore, we should fear His wrath and not do anything against them. But He promises grace and every blessing to all who keep these commandments. Therefore, we should also love and trust in Him and gladly do what He commands.

What does repent mean?

Read the following verses to find symptoms of repentance:

- Mark 1:15
- Luke 24:47
- Matthew 3:8 and Luke 15:20

Symptoms of repentance include believing in the Gospel, forgiveness, and love.

With this in mind, is repentance just about being sorry? Compare and contrast Peter and Judas during Holy Week.

Read:

- Matthew 26:75
- Matthew 27:3-5

When Peter realized he betrayed Christ, he wept bitterly. He knew that he had sinned, but he had faith and turned to Christ in his sin. Judas did not believe that he could still be saved and he hanged himself. Judas was sorry for his sins, so sorry that he took his own life. Peter was sorry for his sin as well, but his sorrow turned him from his sin back to Christ, who took the punishment for all of our sins.

Discuss why this biblical repentance is more comforting than the idea that repentance is a good work of “being sorry enough for God to forgive you.”

Christ has already taken the punishment we deserve. Because of our sinful nature, we will never be sorry enough to replace what Christ has done for us and be able to earn our own forgiveness and salvation. There is comfort in knowing that our emotions cannot save us, and that only Christ can and has saved us.

We sin because we are sinners.
We are sinners because we sin.



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Which one of these statements is true?

Read:

- Psalm 51:5
- Romans 3:23
- Romans 7:18

We sin because we are sinners. We are sinful from our conception, and nothing good dwells within us.

Respond to the following.

These prompts are a great chance to get into some good discussion with your students. There are some guidelines included to keep the discussion on track.

- **God really doesn't care about what I do. He has more important things to worry about. As long as I'm a nice person, I'm all right.**

Does your father care about you? Yes, he wants you to be nice, but does he want more than that for you? How much more does your Father in heaven want good things for you?

- **If God really loves me, He wants me to be happy. If I follow my heart and do what feels right, I'm not doing anything wrong.**

Part of being a parent is not just raising happy children, but raising children who are aware of the needs of others. God gives us ten specific commands to follow that show us what is right and what is wrong.

- **Why are Christians so judgmental? The God you believe in is mean because He doesn't want anyone to be themselves or think for themselves about what is right.**

God wants all of His children to be taken care of and doesn't want to lose a single sheep. Yes, His truth is the real truth, not necessarily what we believe or want to be true. As Christians, it is not our place to punish, but we can look out for our neighbor in love when we see something wrong happening.

What is the only way I can deal with the Law honestly?

Read:

- Romans 3:23-24

We cannot deal with the Law on our own. Jesus Christ and His redemption is the only way we can deal with the Law honestly.



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What is the difference between sin and unbelief?

Read:

- Matthew 10:28

We are all sinners; we all mess up and do things imperfectly. Unbelief is when we do not trust that God will take care of our body and soul.

What does it mean to "keep" the commandments?

To keep the commandments means to guard, protect, and treasure the commandments.
