1. What is the gift of the Sixth Commandment?

God gives us **marriage** and the **model for marriage**, which is **Jesus** and the **Church**.

2. What is marriage?

Marriage is when a **man leaves his father and mother** and **makes a life and a family with his wife**. In this union, the **man and woman** become **one flesh**.

3. What does it mean to lead a chaste life?

Chastity is not just refraining from sex before marriage, or merely not cheating on your spouse. Chastity is about **protecting your family**, even if you don't have it yet. Even as a teenager, you can do things in thought, word and deed that will be helpful (**or hurtful**) in building your future family. In terms of what you **think** - lustful thoughts or thoughts which are the result from viewing porn will change **how you see your family**. In respect to what you do, consider what consequences premarital sex have on your future family. In the matter of what you **say** - **words have power**. How you think about those of the opposite sex will color the way you see your **future husband or wife**.

4. What does Jesus say about marriage and divorce?

Jesus says that **marriage** was **not created** to include **divorce**. But because of man's sin, **unforgiveness** and **hardness of heart**, divorce came about. He says that anyone who is **divorced and remarried**, except in instances of sexual immorality, **commits adultery**.

5. Are there any instances which may allow divorce?

Sexual immorality and **desertion** (abandonment).

6. For whom did God design marriage?

He who created them from the beginning made them **male and female**.

7. What is the gift of the Seventh Commandment?

God gives us **possessions**.

8. What is the root of all evil?

The **love of money** is the root of all evil.

9. What are ways we break the Seventh Commandment?

10. What are other ways we steal?

When we **borrow** from others and **do not pay them back** we are stealing. We are also stealing when we give a **dishonest amount back** to the person.

11. Who is our neighbor?

Our neighbor is **anybody we know** or **don't know**, who owns "stuff." This includes **stores** and **other businesses**. So **shoplifting** from a store or **taking office supplies** from a company would also be **sinning against our neighbors**.

12. Is ignoring your neighbor in need a sin?

Yes, this is a sin. God **loves your neighbor** and in this commandment He demands that we **not only** avoid taking our neighbor's possessions but work to "improve and protect his possessions and income."
