Energize in 5, 4, 3, 2, 1

Get hearts pumping with a quick sequence of exercises. Call out five actions for your students to do as quickly as they can. For instance, five jumping jacks, four push-ups, three situps, two squat jumps, and one burpee.



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Instruction/Discussion

What is the Sixth Commandment?

You shall not commit adultery.

What does this mean?

We should fear and love God so that we lead a sexually pure (chaste) and decent life in what we say and do, and husband and wife love and honor each other.

What is the gift of the Sixth Commandment?

God gives us marriage and the model for marriage, which is Jesus and the Church.

What is marriage?

Read

- Genesis 2:24-25

Marriage is when a man leaves his father and mother and makes a life and a family with his wife. In this union, the man and woman become one flesh.

In a previous printing of *Luther's Small Catechism*, the meaning to this commandment says, "...we lead a chaste and decent life..." What does it mean to lead a chaste life?

Use your best judgment based on age and maturity level when discussing these topics. They will also be brought up again in more depth in Confirmation - Year 3.

Chastity is not just refraining from sex before marriage, or merely not cheating on your spouse. Chastity is about protecting your family, even if you don't have one yet. Even as a teenager, you can do things in thought, word, and deed that will be helpful (or hurtful) to building your future family. In terms of what you think, lustful thoughts or thoughts which are the result from viewing porn will change how you see your family. In respect to what you do, consider what consequences premarital sex will have on your future family. In the matter of what you say, words have power. How you speak about those of the opposite sex will color the way you see your future husband or wife.

Can we practice chastity perfectly? Why should we still try?

Read

- 1 John 1:8-10
- Matthew 7:24-27

No, we cannot practice chastity perfectly because we are all sinners. We should still try to practice chastity for the protection of our family, whether we have one now or in the future.



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What does Jesus say about marriage and divorce?

Read

- Matthew 19:1-9

Jesus says that marriage was not created to include divorce. But because of man's sin, unforgiveness and hardness of heart, divorce came about. He says that anyone who is divorced and remarried, except in instances of sexual immorality, commits adultery.

Keeping in mind the previous question, do you think there are instances which may allow for divorce?

Sexual immorality and desertion (abandonment).

Should reconciliation be attempted in cases of abuse?

Reconciliation shouldn't even be considered if anyone is unsafe.

Reconciliation, if possible, should be sought only *after*

- all legal requirements are met.
- emotional, mental, and physical safety are assured for all victims.
- the abuser and the victim(s) have gone through separate and safe counseling, as well as confession and Absolution.
- joint counseling has taken place and is determined to be safe by all interested parties and counselors.

Is divorce a sin? Is there forgiveness? Where?

Read

- Mark 10:2-16

Yes, divorce is a sin. But Christ fulfilled the Law perfectly for us. Therefore, we find forgiveness in His death and crucifixion on the Cross.

For whom did God design marriage?

He who created them from the beginning made them male and female.

Why does God design marriage this way (between one male and one female, for life)?

- God doesn't set up the Sixth Commandment just so He can judge people, or so that only "good people" can get into heaven.
- He protects marriage because marriage was created to be a picture of Christ and the Church.
- With Jesus' saving of His Church, we get the "why" behind the "what" of the Sixth Commandment. "In marriage we see a picture of the communion between Christ and His bride, the Church." (LSB 275)



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- The one-flesh union of husband and wife is seen in the children God procreates through them.

What is the Seventh Commandment?

You shall not steal.

What does this mean?

We should fear and love God so that we do not take our neighbor's money or possessions, or get them in any dishonest way, but help him to improve and protect his possessions and income.

What is the gift of the Seventh Commandment?

God gives us possessions.

What is the root of all evil?

Read

- 1 Timothy 6:10

The love of money is the root of all evil.

What are ways we break the Seventh Commandment?

Have students take a couple of minutes to brainstorm answers.

YOUR NEIGHBOR'S VISIBLE STUFF

- Take money from mom/dad/siblings
- Take things that don't belong to you
- Shoplift
- Theft online (download or watch something you didn't pay for)
- Digital piracy: recording something you didn't pay for or have permission to record

YOUR NEIGHBOR'S INVISIBLE STUFF

- Take credit for something you didn't do
- Cheat on a test
- Waste time at school/work/practice
- Plagiarize

What are other ways we steal?

Read

- Psalm 37:21
- Leviticus 19:35

When we borrow from others and do not pay them back we are stealing. We are also stealing when we give a dishonest amount back to the person.



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Who is our neighbor?

Our neighbor is anybody we know or don't know, who owns "stuff." This includes stores and other businesses. So shoplifting from a store or taking office supplies from a company would also be sinning against our neighbors.

Is ignoring your neighbor in need a sin?

Read

- 1 John 3:17

Yes, this is a sin. God loves your neighbor and in this commandment He demands that we not only avoid taking our neighbor's possessions but work to "improve and protect his possessions and income."
